



Since it was founded in 1968 by the Harvard Business School Advisory Group as well as academics and business leaders of the Philippines, AIM has been committed to contributing to the growth of Asian businesses and societies by developing professional, entrepreneurial, and socially responsible managers and leaders.





WHY CHOOSE AIM

AIM is a pioneering management school with an immersive, supportive, and practitioner-oriented culture that develops managers, entrepreneurs, and leaders who deliver meaningful growth to Asian businesses and societies.

AIM is one of the first South East Asian business schools and the only one in the Philippines to be accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). AACSB is a global nonprofit association that connects educators, students, and businesses to foster the development of future leaders. Notably, AACSB accreditation is held to a higher standard than many other accreditation bodies, ensuring excellence in business education and promoting innovation and leadership in the industry.

WHAT IS SZSDM

Since its inception, the Stephen Zuellig Graduate School of Development Management (SZSDM) has developed managers who lead sustainable development, inspire their organizations, and transform their communities into resilient, sustainable, and inclusive societies. It has produced over one thousand development managers from 40 countries within and beyond Asia, molding the next generation development leaders, professionals, and change agents. Initially offering the Master in Development Management (MDM) program, SZSDM broke new ground by offering the Executive Master in Disaster Risk and Crisis Management (EMDRCM) program, the first degree program of its kind to be offered to executives and apex change leaders.

Together, both programs espouse the goals of the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals, transforming students into effective leaders and experts in the field of development management.



Executive Master in Disaster Risk and Crisis Management

Manage risk, avert crisis

With climate and social changes overwhelming traditional planning, we must aim to foster prosperous, inclusive, and resilient Asian communities. To develop exceptional leaders in these fields, our Executive Master in Disaster Risk and Crisis Management (EMDRCM) program is designed to provide the skills and experience to tackle large-scale wicked problems and risks. Our unique 18-month online program covers a breadth of necessary subjects, so graduates can work across different fields, disciplines, occupations, and communities.

The program is aligned with international standards for climate change action, United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. It draws upon the expertise of our international pool of faculty. Students from a wide variety of backgrounds work together to identify and address real-world problems, interacting with global leaders from the field. This culminates in an in-depth capstone project which provides communities, businesses, and governments with workable recommendations to address social, environmental, and climate related problems.

The EMDRCM program equips leaders with the skills to assess, strategize, and make evidence-based decisions while aligning with international frameworks for disaster risk reduction, sustainable development, and climate action. Join us in shaping a safer, stronger, and more sustainable future.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The EMDRCM curriculum provides training in the following concentration areas: (a) Organizational Resilience. (b) Disaster Resilience and Sustainable Development, and (c) Crisis and Humanitarian Emergency Management. The students will gain exposure in these areas in three stages:

Expert understanding and broader perspectives in concentration areas with integrative content

Professor Chad Michael Briggs is a globally recognized expert in environmental risks, climate change, and implications for military and security planning. Dr. Briggs has previously held positions as Special Advisor on climate change and strategic assessment to the US Department of Energy, and was Minerva Chair and Professor of Energy and Environmental Security at the US Air University (US Air Force). Since 2011 has worked in Ukraine and Kosovo on behalf of USAF, NATO, and the European Union, and was twice awarded Fulbright professorships to Budapest, Hungary, and Berlin, Germany.

Beyond his work in environmental and energy security, Dr. Briggs is also deeply involved in environmental health policy and risk assessment, particularly in post-conflict regions. His strategic intelligence assessments have been invaluable in addressing environmental challenges in these areas. Dr. Briggs remains a Research Professor at the University of Alaska Anchorage, and lecturer for the Global Security Studies program at Johns Hopkins University. He is an executive member of the Global Military Advisory Council on Climate Change (GMACCC), and in the Philippines conducts research on disaster intelligence and early warning signals for climate change impacts. He has a PhD in Political Science from Carleton University, including extensive work on environmental geography at University College London.

ADMISSIONS

Eligibility Criteria

- Must have a Bachelor's degree (or an equivalent qualification) in a technical or non-technical field
- At least five years' work experience, preferably with a minimum of two years' managerial experience
- Proficiency in oral and written English (test result from TOEFL, IELTS, or DET)

Application Process

- 1. Fill out the application form at devatwork.aim.edu
- 2. Send the following documents to emdrcm@aim.edu
 - a. Updated Curriculum Vitae
 - b. Copy of undergraduate Transcript of Academic Records (TOR) or mark sheet
 - c. A Letter of Motivation
 - d. A valid government ID (passport ID page is preferred)
 - e. Diploma
 - f. Copy of TOEFL, IELTS, or DET test result
- Take the NMAT test. The NMAT by GMAC is a two-hour timed, 108-question test that covers language skills, quantitative ability, and logical reasoning. It is conducted online via Zoom. Each of the three sections are individually timed
- 4. Qualified applicants will undergo an admissions interview with the program faculty
- 5. The Admissions result will be sent via email or can be accessed through the AIM Portal
- To reserve a slot, pay a USD1,000 registration fee, which will be deducted from the total program fee



FINANCIAL AID

Alumni Promotion

Alumni of the School of Executive Education and Lifelong Learning (SEELL) – formerly the School of Executive Education – will be entitled to 10% off the total program fee.

Alumni of any AIM degree program or their family members to the first degree of consanguinity or affinity will be entitled to 20% off the total program fee.

An applicant who fulfills both criteria will be eligible for a maximum of 20% off.

Early Bird Rate (For July 2024 Intake)

Tier 1: Payment of Registration Fee (USD1,000) on or before 30 April 2024 entitles enrollees to a USD1,500 program fee reduction.

Tier 2: Payment of Registration Fee (USD1,000) on or before 31 May 2024 entitles enrollees to a USD1,000 program fee reduction.

Grants-In-Aid

Grants-in-aid are awarded based on merit and the applicant's financial needs. It covers up to 25% of program fees.

Grant applications are processed once applicants are admitted into the program. AIM reserves the right not to award these scholarships if no qualified candidates are identified.

Diversity Grant

The Diversity Grant is a program fee discount for foreign students amounting to a maximum of USD3,000 awarded based on the student's potential to contribute to the diversity of the class, professional records, and other standard recruitment and admissions merits.

Vinod Thomas Scholarship

The Vinod Thomas Scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student under the Executive Master in Disaster Risk and Crisis Management (EMDRCM) program. Students awarded this scholarship must have no failing marks in any subject. Completion of the program in 18 months is required.

Sustainable Leadership Learning for Climate and Disaster Risk Reduction

The Sustainable Leadership Learning for Climate and Disaster Risk Reduction (SLL-CDRR) is granted to exceptional individuals working in National Government Agencies (NGAs) responsible for climate change and disaster resilience, DRRM officers in Local Government Units (LGUs), women spearheading Climate Change Adaptation (CCA), leaders from Indigenous Groups, and Champions of Sustainability and Inclusivity. Successful completion of this program is required within an 18-month timeframe.

Loans

Institutional Loan Programs (Applicable to Program Fee Only)

AIM offers two loan programs to help Filipinos and Philippine-based foreigners* focus on their education. Slots are limited in these programs and priority will be given only to qualified early applicants. The maximum loan amount is 80% of the program fee. No collateral is required for the loan program.

1. Study Now, Pay Later: 0% Loan Program

- Repayment Tenure 3 years to 5 years
- Monthly Amortization starts 6 months from the scheduled end-date of the program
- Limited slots only


2. AIM Study Loan Program

- Repayment Tenure 3 years to 5 years
- Monthly Amortization starts 3 months from the scheduled end-date of the program
- Indicative interest rate of 6%**

Loan Application Requirements

Submit scanned copies of the following documents for applicant and co-maker***

- · Certificate of Employment with salary information included
- Income Tax Return or payslip
- Copy of Official Transcript of Records with Cumulative Grade Point Average
- Any valid government ID (passport ID page is preferred)
- Loan Application form
